

THE NEXT MUNICIPAL ELECTION WILL BE HELD ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 15, 2022

In the District of North Vancouver, residents will elect a total of 11 individuals - 1 Mayor, 6 Councilors, and 4 School Trustees. Individuals are elected for 4-year terms.

WHY VOTE?

Municipal governments make decisions regarding housing, transportation, parks, support for vulnerable people, and many other important local issues. Voting is your chance to influence who will represent you at Council. Make your vote count by getting informed about the candidates that best reflect your values and priorities on local issues. Please encourage your friends and family to get informed and vote too!

WHO CAN VOTE?

To vote in the local municipal elections, you must:

- Be a Canadian citizen
- Be at least 18 years old on election day
- Be a resident of the District
- Have been a resident of BC since April 14, 2022
- Not be disqualified from voting in an election

HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE

If you are already registered, you might have received a voter information card in the mail. Your voter registration card will tell you where and how to vote.

If you do not have your voter information card, you can register to vote in two ways:

1. **Online:** You can register online at the [Elections BC](#) website by August 23, 2022..
2. **In person:** On election day or at an advance polling station. You will need to bring your identification (ID) and proof of your physical address. [What types of ID can you use?](#)

HOW TO VOTE

1. Voting in Advance – by Mail

Any eligible person can vote by mail but you must first apply to do this. Application forms are available [online](#) or for pick up at Municipal Hall (355 W Queens Rd, North Vancouver).

1. Complete the *vote by mail* application and submit it by September 21, 2022 – you can submit a completed application by mail, email, or in person at Municipal Hall.
2. After submitting your application, a ballot package will be sent to you by mail or held for pickup as indicated in your application.
3. Return your completed mail ballot package and any supporting documents to the Chief Election Officer. The ballot must be received before the close of voting at 8 p.m. on Saturday, October 15, 2022.

2. Voting in Advance – in Person

There are **three days** of advance voting in two locations within the District. Locations & dates are listed below:

3. Voting on Election Day – in Person

If you are voting on election day, you must vote in person at a designated location. All voting places are open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Saturday, October 15, 2022.
